

# Supporting questions in mapping the state-of-the-art

The following questions help in mapping the state-of-the-art for a research proposal:

## Defining the key terms

- What are the key terms we use to look at the practice issue, and how are these defined in the literature?

## Describing the practice issue

- According to the literature, what are the characteristics of the issue? What should we pay attention to?
- According to the literature, what are the characteristics of the desired situation? When is a situation good/effective?

## Explaining the issue

- According to the literature, what are the causes or reasons for this problem occurring?

## Designing the solution

- What solutions does the literature offer?
- What requirements are set to the solution in the literature?

## Explaining the solutions

- According to the literature, what are the reasons for a specific solution working, or not working?
- According to the literature, what are the conditions for success and things to take into account?

## Designing the research project itself

- Which data collection methods can I use?
- Which data analysis methods can I use?
- Operationalise the terms to be measured. E.g 'What are existing surveys?'.
