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BACKGROUND

Implementation of **effective multi-component fall prevention interventions** (FPIs)¹ often fails due to **the complex context of the community** involving multiple stakeholders within and across multiple settings, sectors and organizations².

AIM

What contextual factors influence the implementation of effective FPIs in the community?

METHODS



Search in **scientific publications** and **grey literature** (n=14).



Four focus groups with healthcare professionals and social work professionals (n=34).

Interprofessional communication and collaboration is key to successful implementation of fall prevention interventions in the community

KEY FINDINGS

BARRIERS

- Financial aspects
- Time

FACILITATORS

- To the context adaptable intervention
- Dedicated team

BARRIERS & FACILITATORS

- Interprofessional communication and collaboration
- Leadership and coordination



Adequate collaborative community relationships may improve the **assurance and continuity** of the implementation process and promote adequate **teamwork**.

Also, **sufficient leadership and coordination** across departments and specialists are considered **important enhancing factors** to successful implementation.
