REGISTRATION

Cost to attend the institute is \$550. Registration will be available from January 1, 2019 until April 17, 2019 and is limited to 25 participants.

LODGING

Lodging will be provided by TCU Housing, in the heart of TCU’s campus, in suite-style accommodations. Each participant will have own bedroom with shared bathroom and a kitchen. Lodging will be available for participants, as needed, from June 2 through June 6 at a cost of \$85 a day.
